Hey Everyone. We've got some big news for you. In early November the Iowa Ornithologists Union will be having their fall meeting in Dubuque. If you're



not familiar with the I.O.U., they are a group that was founded way back in

1923 to bring together people from Iowa who share an interest in learning about and enjoy watching birds. From the start they have met in the spring to conduct business, enjoy birds during migration and just to be sociable. In the 1950s, some members began meeting informally in fall and those events evolved into a second annual meeting that continues today. And this fall they are coming to Dubuque for the first time in years.

The event will be a three day event from November 10th through November 12th. The main get-togethers will be held at the Holiday Inn, 450 Main Street in downtown Dubuque. The event will start on Friday night with a get-together

We will be leading field trips to the John Deere Marsh, Swiss Valley, The Mines of Spain, Green Island, the Potosi Boat Landing/ Marsh and all along the Mississippi here in Dubuque.
